In the name of God Amen the Five & twentieth day of June in the six & thirtieth yeare of the Raigne of our Soverigne Lord Charles the Second by the Grace of God of England Scotland France & Ireland King defender of the Faith & Anoque dom[ini] 1684 I Edward Bacon of Albourne in the County of Wilts yeoman being Aged & weake in body But of sound and good memory thanks be therefore given to Almighty God for the same doe make this my last will & testament in manner & forme Following (that is to say) **First** and principally I commend my soule to Allmighty God my Creator hoping and assuredly beeleeving that I shall receive full pardon and remission of my Sins in & through the precious Death & merritts of my redeemer the Lord Jesus Christ And to inherit everlasting life And my body I commit to the earth to be decently buried according to the discretion of my executrix hereafter named And as touching the disposition of all such temporall estate As the Lord in mercy hath lent me I give & dispose thereof as Followeth **First** I order that all my debts & funeral expenses bee payed & discharged within one month next after my decease **Item** I give & devise to my Kinsman **Thomas** Neweth of Swindon in the County of Wilts All my right titles claimes & demand whatsoever which I now hath or hereafter May have In all that land housing and lands in Swindon now inn the possession of the sayed Thomas Neweth And also all that housing & lands now or late in the possession of the widow Neweth with all and singular the App<sup>ur</sup>ten<sup>an</sup>ces to the same p<sup>re</sup>mises belonging together with all such writeings & evidences that I now hath in my Custody touch or Concerning the same To hold unto the sayed Thomas Neweth for & during the terme of his Naturall life And from & immediately after his Naturall life I give and devise all & singular the before mencioned premises unto my kinswoman Martha now wife of the aforesayed Thomas Neweth To hold unto her & her Assignes for & during the terme of her naturall life And from & immediately after the decease of the sayed Thomas Neweth & Martha Neweth I give & devise all the aforesayed premises unto Edward Neweth their Son To hold to him & his heires for ever And for want of such I give to the heires of the sayed Thomas Neweth upon the body of the sayed Martha begotten or to bee begotten Item I give & bequeath to my kinswoaman William Bacons daughter of London Five pounds Item I give & bequeath to my kinsman William Bacon Son of John Bacon of Albourne Five pounds Item I give & bequeath to my kinsman Edward Bacon Son of John Bacon of Albourne aforesayed Five pounds Item I give & bequeath to my kinsman Edward Neweth son of Thomas Neweth of Swindon Five pounds Item I give and bequeath to my kinswoaman Mary Neweth daughter of the aforesayed Thomas Neweth & Martha Neweth Five pounds Item I give & bequeath to all the Children borne of the body of my kinswoaman Ann House of Childrey in the Country of Berks twenty shillings Apeece **Item** I give & bequeathe to my kinswoaman Jane Thatchers Children twenty shillings apeece Item I give & bequeath to my kinsman Burly the son of my brother Stephen Bacons daughter Alice twenty shillings Item I give & bequeath to my brother Stephen Bacons daughter Anns Children twenty shillings Apeece And my will & meaneing is that if my kinswoaman the daughter of my kinsman William Bacon of London shall depart his life before the legacy shall bee due And payable to her that then if shee leave any child or children borne of her body behind her that then this legacy given to the sayed William Bacons daughter shall be payed to him her or them of such child or children and shall be left at the time this legacy is due; And my will & meaneing is also that all these legacyes before bequeatherd shall be well & truely payed to the severall legatyes

within six months next after my decease If the same shall be lawfully demanded of my executrix And I doe order and Apoynte my executrix that shee pay the legacyes given to William Bacon Edward Bacon Edward Neweth and Mary Neweth to their Fathers And their Fathers give discharge to my executrix for the same And that John Bacon & Thomas Neweths Anguittances shall bee sufficient discharge for my executrix And I doe order also that my kinsmen John Bacon & Thomas Neweth shall imediately after the receipt of the legacyes given to their children that they putt it out to interest for them And that the profitts that shall arise from thence until they come to the age of one & twenty yeares of age shall bee for the only use & beehoofe of their sayed children And at that age then the sayed John Bacon & Thomas Neweth shall well & truely pay the sayed legacyes to their sayed children together with the interest thereof And the sayed legatyes are then required to give discharge And I order that all my other legatyes tender and give discharges to my executrix at the time they receave their legacyes or otherwise I order my executrix to forbeare to pay them I give and bequeath to the poore of the p<sup>ar</sup>ish of Albourne Forty Shillings to be payed by my executrix with in one month after my decease to be disposed of by my executrix & overseers according to their discretion **All the** rest of my goods & chatles of what sort soever my debts legacyes & funerall expenses being payed & discharged I give and bequeath to Elizabeth my deare wife whom I make ordeyne & Appoint sole executrix of this my last will & testament **And I doe** intreate my loving Kinsmen & Friends William Bacon Thomas Collman & <illegible> all of Albourne to be overseers of this my last will & testament intreateing them that they will Ayde & Assist my executrix so that all things herein my will may be performed according to my true intent & meaneing And I give unto them twenty shillings Apeece In Wittness whereof that this is my last will & testament I hath hereunto sett my hand & seale the day & year above written
