BOND of Administration of the Goods of **Daniel Velvin** Intestate Decease At **Bradford** on the 10th day of December 1841 Administration of the Goods and Chattels of the above-said Deceased was by the Reverend **Charles Silvanus Meech** Clerk M.A. lawful Surrogate of the Rev^d and Worshipful **William Macdonald** Clerk M.A. Archdeacon of the Archdry of Wilts granted and committed unto **John Velvin** the lawful Brother and next of Kin of the said deceased (being first duly Sworn that the said Deceased died intestate and well and truly to Administer, and to exhibit a true and perfect Inventory of the Goods, Chattels, and Credits of the said Deceased, and yield a just and true Account when lawfully required) saving the Rights of all Persons.

YOU swear that the Content of the Affidavit hereunto annexed, and to which you have subscribed your name are true, to the best of your Knowledge and Belief. And that **Daniel Velvin** late of **Aldbourne** in the County of Wilts your late brother deceased, died without leaving any last Will or Testament, as far as you know or believe; that you will duly administer his Goods, and pay his Debts, so far as his Goods, Chattels, and Credits will thereto extend, and the Law bind you; and that you will make, or cause to be made, a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods, Chattels and Credits of the said deceased, which, since his death, have and shall come to your Hands, Possession, or Knowledge, and exhibit the same into the Registry of the Archdeacon of Wilts and pass a just and true Account of your Administration, when thereto lawfully required; You also swear that the Goods, Chattels, and Credits of the said deceased are under the value of Twenty Pounds. **So help you GOD.** (Kiss the Book.)

Know all Men by these Presents that We **John Velvin** of **Bradford** in the County of Wilts Upholsterer **Matthew Newth** of **Bradford** aforesaid Gentleman and **John Kelson** of the same place Gentleman are held and firmly bound unto **William Macdonald** Clerk M.A. Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Wilts in the Sum of Thirty Eight Pounds, of good and lawful Money of Great Britain to be paid unto the said Archdeacon or to his certain Attorney his Executors Administrators or Assigns, to which Payment well and truly to be made, We oblige ourselves and each of us by himself severally for the whole our and each of our Heirs, Executors, and Administrators, firmly by these Present sealed with our seals, dated the sixteenth day of December in the fifth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord, ~~George the Fourth~~ Lady Victoria, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, ~~King~~ Queen Defender of the Faith, &c. And in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and forty one.

The Condition of this Obligation is such That if the above bounden **John Velvin** the lawful Brother next of Kin and Administrator of all and singular the Goods Chattles, and Credits of **Daniel Velvin** late of **Aldbourn** in the County of Wilts deceased do make, or cause to be made, a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods, Chattles, and Credits of the said deceased, which have, or shall come to the Hands, Possession, or Knowledge of him the said **John Velvin** or into the Hands and Possession of any Person or Persons for him and the same so made do exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the Registry of the Archdeacon of Wilts at or before the last day of March next ensuing, and the same Goods, Chattles, and Credits and all other the Goods, Chattles, and Credits of the said deceased, at the time of his death which at any time after shall come to the hands or Possession of the said **John Velvin** or into the hands and Possession of any other Person or Persons for him do well and truly administer according to Law, and further do make or cause to be made a true and just Accompt of his said Administration at or before the last day of December One Thousand Eight Hundred and forty two (if required,) and all the Rest and Residue of the said Goods, Chattles, and Credits which shall be found remaining upon the said Administrator's Accompt, the same being first examined and allowed of by the Judge or Judges for the time being of the said Court shall deliver and pay unto such Person or Persons respectively, as the said Judge or Judges by his or their Decree or Sentence pursuant to the true Intent and Meaning of a late Act of Parliament made in the Two and Twentieth and Three and Twentieth Years of the Reign of our late Sovereign Lord King Charles the Second intituled "an Act for the better settling of Intestates Estates," shall limit and appoint, and if it shall hereafter appear that any last Will and Testament was made by the said deceased, and the Executor or Executors therein named do exhibit the same into the said Court making request to have it allowed and approved accordingly if the said **John Velvin** above bounden being thereunto required, do render and deliver the said Letters of Administration, (approbation of such Testament being first had and made) in the said Court, then this Obligation to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue.
