



Here briefly are the functions dealt with by the RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL at the moment:

All applications for plans to build, alter or add to private houses or estates. Building, repairing, letting, and maintenance, of all Council Houses, Shops

Collection of all rates - County Council and Parish Councils draw the money they

require(and have planned for) from the rates collected by

Refuse & Sewage disposal. Rights of Way - maintenance, closures and disputes pertaining to all Rights of Way. Electoral Register - the up-to-date compilation of the Register which entitles you to vote in any election.

METHODIST YOUTH CLUB 'R & L' WEEK DURING JULY. PREVAILED UPON THE COUNTY COUNCIL TO PROVIDE ROAD MARKINGS ON THE A419 (VILLAGE CENTRE) IN THE INTERESTS OF PUBLIC SAFETY.

PARISH GRASS MOWING IS UNDERTAKEN DURING MAY, JUNE, JULY & AUGUST, COSTING THE P.COUNCIL 256.75 PER MONTH.

PARISH ACCOUNTS ARE AUDITED EACH JULY, PARTICULARS BEING AVAILABLE TO THE GENERAL PUBLIC.

PARISH LIGHTING IS CONTROLLED BY THE PARISH COUNCIL AND PAID FOR FROM PARISH FUNDS.



## local personalities.

1. MR OLIVER HAWKINS

'Father' of the Parish, Oliver Hawkins will complete 50 years Council service next March - a worthy achievement by any

A 'Dabchick' by birth, he was educated at the local School, leaving to work on the land when only ten and a half years

He has been connected with Agriculture most of his life, and until his retirement, farmed on his own account. His association with the Church has been life long, being a Methodist Lay Preacher for upwards of 60 years. His acceptance of the tenets of the Christian Faith gave the realisation that Life had a Purpose, and this acceptance gave him not only an interest in the Church, but also Public Life. A County Councillor for 18 years, he was made an Alderman prior to retirement.

Forward looking in outlook, he is perhaps responsible more than any other man alive today for the very high standards set by the Parish in our immediate locality.

With his brother Christopher, he fought for local amenities, and helped to ensure for the Parish Main Water and Drainage Supplies, services taken for granted today. The village also had its own Electricity Supply in 1930. Some years ago he was the Liberal Party Agent for the Devizes Constituency, but like many good men before him, later changed his Political Outlook.

Oliver Hawkins has always keenly supported local Sporting interests and has been a Vice-President of both the Football and Cricket Clubs.

The Parish would be a sorrier place without him.
